

Remember KASHI?

We posted a photo in the February newsletter of a little male shelter puppy that had been labeled as a "Pit-mix" and was scheduled to be killed because of his breed. As a rescue group, CCHS was able to pull

him from the shelter and take responsibility for him. We sent a sample of his blood to a DNA testing lab and asked YOU what breed you thought Kashi was. We got guesses of Pit Bull, Jack Russell, and Pointer/Boxer mix, but nobody came up with the correct breed; Kashi's DNA test results list him as a mix of the following breeds, which were detected in the last three generations of Kashi's ancestry: **LHASA APSO, COCKER SPANIEL, and BRITTANY SPANIEL**. Just goes to show that you shouldn't judge a pup by his or her looks!
