Training Tip of the Month: Wait at Doors

Start by putting a leash on your dog. Then, ask your dog to sit next to you about 5 feet in front of a closed door inside your home. Say "wait" and move your hand down in a swinging pendulum motion in front of your dog (not too close--at least 8 inches away so as not to frighten him). Then move your hand to the doorknob. If your dog stays, continue to open the door. If your dog moves, say "oops" and gently close the door, dropping your hand back to your side. Wait 5 seconds and then try again. Do not proceed to opening the door fully until your dog remains in the sit position.

Once the door is open and your dog is still sitting (what a smart dog!), say "good boy" or "good girl" and then immediately give him a yummy treat. Pre-select a word such as "release" or "go" and step forward through the door to give your dog permission to move through the doorway.

As your dog improves, practice "wait" at various doorways inside your home and then finally practice at the door to the

Sadly, between 3 and 4 million dogs and cats are euthanized each year in the United States simply because too many people give up their pets and too few people adopt from shelters. Because there is limited space at shelters, staff members sometimes need to make very hard decisions to euthanize animals who haven't been adopted.

The number of euthanized animals could be reduced dramatically if more people adopted pets instead of buying them. By adopting from a private humane society or animal shelter, breed rescue group, or the local animal control agency, you'll help save the lives of two animals--the pet you adopt and a homeless animal somewhere who can be rescued because of space you helped free up. outside. This same technique may be used for car doors to teach your dog to wait for permission to exit the car. Please be careful not to injure your dog's nose as you close doors during training. You may use your body to prevent your dog from getting too close.

Carroll County Animal Shelter Wins Special Toys For Tots Trophy

CCHS would like to congratulate the staff of the Carroll County Animal Shelter for the recognition they received from the Marine Toys For Tots Foundation. The foundation awarded the shelter the 2011 Community Cup Trophy for their creative two-pronged contribution to this community-wide event. In November and December of 2011, people who donated a toy at the shelter's drop site were given the opportunity to adopt a homeless animal from the shelter at a reduced price. As a result, 312 lucky shelter animals were adopted during that two-month period, and the shelter collected a record 550 toys for needy children in a year when donations were reportedly down overall. 2011 was the second year that the staff has volunteered the animal shelter as a drop site, and they are already looking ahead to November/December 2012 to make it their third year.

The shelter will get to display the trophy for the whole year until it is passed on to next year's winner. At that time, they will receive a permanent plaque honoring this achievement. So the next time you stop by the shelter, be sure to look for it!
