
\$55 for small dogs (under 40 lbs) and puppies; \$35 for large dogs (over 40 lbs) and older dogs (over age 3)

- Keep candy out of your pets' reach. While many pet owners know that chocolate can be bad for their animals, xylitol - a sweetener used in candy and gum - can be toxic to them too.

 pose a risk for injury.
- dangerous, so be sure to keep them safely away from pets. Candle flames can set fire to a pet's fur. Hanging or dangling decorations can be an entanglement or choking hazard to some animals.
- Use fake cobwebs sparingly, if at all. Pets can choke on fake cobwebs set up indoors. Outdoors, fake webs may be a hazard to birds and wildlife.
- When going out trickor-treating, leave your dog at home. Dogs can be easily excited by the Halloween commotion and a dog bite or lost dog will quickly end the evening's fun.
